Key Learning
There are seven continents: Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Australasia, Europe, North America and
South America. Some continents have many countries, others do not.
There are five oceans in the world: the Arctic Ocean, the Atlantic Ocean, the Indian Ocean,
the Pacific Ocean and the Southern Ocean.
Countries around the world have different climates. Climates can be sorted into the follow-
ing zones: warm, cold (or polar), tropical and temperate. Countries near the equator tend to
have a hotter climate. Different animals are better suited to living in countries with a partic-
When people plan a journey, they might use maps and a compass to help them. You can
record a journey on a map using a journey line.
We can look at aerial photos of places and see different features. Some of these are made
(or changed) by humans, others are natural (made by nature). Natural features include
caves, rocks, cliffs, forests and mountains. Natural features are sometimes called 'physical
features.' Features made by people include bridges, buildings and roads. These features are
sometimes called 'human features.'
