Children will work with maps and globes and locate Australia. Children will

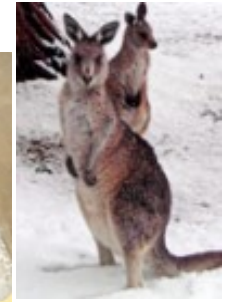
Explore key physical features of Australia.
