Important Facts:

• There are 5 main biomes: aquatic, desert, forest, grassland and tundra.

• Biomes can be seen all around the world and there are different ones depending on environmental conditions.

• It is important to preserve and conserve these biomes because human activity is causing some of them to be damaged or changed.

• The animals and plants in a biome will have adapted to the area so that they are more likely to survive there.

Key Vocabulary:

Globe: A spherical model of the Earth.

Biome: A community of plants and/or animals that have common adaptations for the area that they live in.

Conservation: Stopping something from being lost or reduced.

Preservation: Keeping something the same or stopping it from being damaged. **Country:** A nation with its own government that occupies a particular place.

Continent: A large landmass. There are 7 continents in the world.

Natural environment: All living and non-living things that have happened naturally, they haven't been made by humans.

Man-made: Made or caused by human beings.

Equator: Divides the northern and southern hemispheres of the world and is an equal distance from both the North and the

South pole.

Adaptation: The process of change that allows a species to become better suited to its environment.
