Key Knowledge

Johann Sebastian Bach was a famous German composer of orchestral and church music.

Born on March 21, 1685.

Died in 1750

His work is considered to be some of the finest examples of a style of music known as baroque.

Baroque – The name given to a style of music written in western Europe between 1600-1750





A harpsichord is played by pressing keys which pluck strings inside the main body of the instrument. Unlike other keyboard instruments, you can't change the volume of a note on a harpsichord by pressing a key harder or more gently.

A clavichord is similar to a harpsichord but instead of the strings being plucked they are hit, like in a piano. The main difference is that they are very small and quiet. People like Johann Sebastian Bach would have used them to practise organ music at home.
