Lost Property

As we start the new year, we already have a large amount of lost property (mainly from the end of last academic year). Attendance

Attendance is always very important in school and it was very pleasing to see improvements throughout last academic year.

We have started this academic year positively and would love to see this continue. We do understand that children can be ill from time and time and this may require time away from school. We would encourage parents to check the NHS website https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/ if their child is unwell. This website lists childhood illnesses and will advise whether a child needs to be absent from school and the recommended duration of absence.

As with last academic year, we will continue with our 'In To Win' initiative and half termly rewards will be in place for every child who has 100% attendance for that half term. The 100% will reset again at the beginning of each half term. This means that every child has 6 opportunities to win prizes throughout the year. Every child who has received 98% attendance or above throughout the full school year will also receive a reward.

We also request that holidays are not taken during term time (please see information opposite). If holidays during term time are unavoidable, please make an appointment with Mr Connor to complete a holiday form. Please note that if your child's attendance should drop below 90% in the 39 school weeks prior to an unauthorised holiday, the Local Authority attendance team will be notified and a penalty notice could be issued.

When children are absent from school due to a medical appointment, evidence of the appointment must be shown to school. If evidence is not shown, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.
