# Holidays

We would, again, like to remind you of our arrangements for the summer half-term holiday of 2022. We have, as we did during previous years, organised all five of our PD days for the last week of half-term in May 2022 (Monday 23rd to Friday 27th May). This falls before the half-term holiday (Whit Week) which occurs at the end of May and the start of June (Monday 30th May to Friday 3rd June). This means that instead of school being closed for just one week, it will be closed for two weeks. In addition, we are putting our PD days together again for during the 2023 summer term also. As a result, school will close on Friday 26th May 2023 and will re-open on Monday 12th June 2023, giving just over two weeks off.

### **Attendance Matters!**

#### Please note the following:

The impact of low attendance on children:

- Friendship/social issues- Children often feel they miss out on friendships and can find it difficult to fit in with their friends on returning to school.
- Academic Ability- Children are disadvantaged from their peers as they miss key lessons.
- Each lesson is a foundation for the next lesson. If a child misses frequent odd days at school, they will miss the foundations for their next steps and learning becomes difficult.

Our children have all missed a lot of school over the last two years because of Covid-19. It is important we help our children to achieve the best they can and be in school as much as possible. Our school target and National target is for attendance is 96.5%.

### **Punctuality Matters!**

The impact of children arriving at school late:

- Embarrassment of walking into a class late and everyone looking at them.
- Disturbing the learning of others.
- Missing important teacher input into the first session.

Our school gates are open from 8:45 until 8:55 to give you a 10-minute window for your children to arrive. All learning begins at 8:55. Children who arrive after the close of the school gates and have to come in through the school office are late.
