
World Book Day

Our first reading raffle has been drawn today. Well done to those children who have had lots of tickets in the class boxes. Thank you for your support at home and keep reading children!



Covid-19

Some classes are in enhanced measures and as a result are needing to isolate in school from mixing with other children. It is strongly advised that children in those classes take a lateral flow test before coming to school until these enhanced measures are relaxed.

We have been advised by Hartlepool's Public Health Department that headaches are a commonly presented symptom of Covid-19 in children. This has been seen in schools throughout the Northeast. We ask that you are mindful of this.

CHANGES to Covid-19 Isolation

From Monday 17th January, people who are self-isolating with Covid-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days.

If your child **tests positive** for Covid-19, they can now take lateral flow tests on day 5 and day 6 of their isolation (24 hours apart). If a negative result is recorded on a lateral flow test (LFD) on **day 5 AND day 6** of their isolation, children can return to school on **day 6 of isolation**, as long as they do not still have a high temperature. If your child tests positive on lateral flow tests between days 5-10 of isolation, they should continue to self-isolate and wait 24 hours before taking another test.

When two consecutive, negative LFD test results are observed, they can end their self-isolation, again as long as they do not have a high temperature (e.g. if your child is positive on day 5, then a negative test is required on day 6 and day 7, or if positive on day 6, then a negative test is required on days 7 and 8, and so on until the end of day 10 to release from isolation). After 10 full days, self-isolation ends.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10-day period of self-isolation.

All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace.

Negative tests on days 4 and 5 do not count. Day 5 is the first day to take a test.
